

How Much Does a Dumpster Rental Cost in 2025?

Average Dumpster Rental Prices by Size

Size	Avg. Cost	Weight Limit	Best For
10 Yard	\$300 – \$500	2–3 tons	Garage, basement, small cleanouts
20 Yard	\$400 – \$700	4–6 tons	Whole-home cleanouts, decks, remodels
30 Yard	\$500 – \$900	5–8 tons	Major renovations, roofing, large estates
40 Yard	\$700 – \$1,400	8–10 tons	New construction, commercial demos

What's Included in the Price

- ✓ Delivery to your location (driveway, job site, etc.)

Extra Fees to Ask About Before You Sign

Extended rental days:	\$10–\$30/day after your rental period
Overweight charge:	\$30–\$75/ton when you exceed the weight limit
Delivery to street (permit):	\$0–\$200 if dumpster goes on public right-of-way
Fuel surcharge:	\$0–\$30 depending on location and gas prices
Prohibited item disposal:	\$50–\$500+ for hazardous materials in the bin

How to Get the Best Price

- Get at least 3 quotes. Prices vary \$200–\$400 for the same bin in the same city.
- Be honest about debris types. Hiding asbestos or hazardous materials = massive surprise charges.
- Know your weight estimate. Heavy debris (concrete, brick) always costs more. Plan for it.
- Ask what's included. Delivery, pickup, 7-day rental and weight limit should all be in the quote.
- Don't overfill. A bin loaded above the top is a safety hazard and an overage charge.
- Book early. Same-day delivery in high-demand areas sometimes has a scheduling surcharge.

Dumpster Size Selection Guide

10 Yard	Best for: Garage cleanouts, basement purges, small bathroom remodels. About 3 pickup truck loads.
20 Yard	Best for: Whole-home cleanouts (2-3 bedroom), deck demolition, large garage clearances. ~6 truck loads.
30 Yard	Best for: Major home renovations, full roofing tear-offs, multi-room demos, large estate cleanouts. ~9 truck loads.
40 Yard	Best for: New construction, large commercial demolitions, heavy debris (concrete/brick). ~12 truck loads.

- X Paint, solvents, and chemicals
- X Medical waste and medications
- X Car batteries and household batteries
- X Asbestos (requires licensed hazardous disposal)
- X Electronics (TVs, monitors)
- X Explosives, ammunition,
